Breed advertising campaign signup under way

One of Colorado Simmental's most popular member benefits is its pick-n-choose co-op breed advertising campaigns. For a nominal rate, members can join the large advertising opportunities in numerous regional ag publications. With a submission deadline nearing, now is the time to sign up for all <u>or</u> part of the CSA ad campaigns.

Ads are priced per publication, with multiple ads to run in each of 6 publications: the *Ag Journal, Fence Post*, CCA's quarterly *Cattle Guard* magazine, *Wyoming Livestock Roundup, New Mexico Stockman*, and Fence Post's annual *Breeder's Connection* magazine. If you want in just a single magazine or paper, then it's \$25. It you want in the entire ad blitz, it is \$150. Based on ASA ad slicks, most of our ads run 4-color in ³/₄ to full pages. Ranchers placing classified & display ads on their own know our \$150 deal is indeed sweet.

Verify participation by Oct. 10 with check & note, or by an email stating which specific publication(s)

and what your 4 lines should say. (Typically, participants list ranch name, contact name & phone number, sale date or private treaty offering, and/or a web site or email address. If questions, just email CSA Sec. Susan at: colosimmental@gmail.com)

Ads will start already with the December *Cattle Guard*, with others making their initial run in late January or early February and continuing through March bull sale season.

OK to pay dues & ads in same check

Scam alert – check your bull buyer calls carefully

"Want to buy the Golden Gate Bridge?" OK, we recognize that line but now the scammers are saying "I want to buy a bull." While you can't ignore those inquiries, we've had several CSA members report getting texts. You might see pink flags when the scam "buyer" fails to ask the right industry questions or won't give a name, but we hope they turn into red flags when the "certified" check comes, it's for the wrong amount on a bank branch that doesn't exist, and they're willing to have you return the excess money by wire, check, etc.

They have pulled names and phone numbers off classified ads, web pages and membership lists, so just a caution to this latest scam that is hitting the beef industry.

Ready or Not – here comes National Western

The 2020 National Western Stock Show is still a few swipes away on your calendar, but CSA preparation work began several months ago.

During the Fall Focus, the ASA board reversed to its previous percentage parameters for the major shows. CSA board quickly conferred. Based on your member feedback at the CSA annual meeting and to be in line with the ASA change, your board immediately put into effect that starting with the 2020 NWSS Simmental shows at Denver, percentage cattle divisions will remain ¹/₂ to ³/₄ blood, with purebred still ⁷/₈-blood and higher.

In the yards, Simmental will be in temporary pens. For pen exhibitors, note there will be washhouses. Arrival routines will be unchanged but the partially renovated landscape sure looks different. In the female pen show, CSA has added in a 2-year-old BRED heifer pen class.

<u>Youth news</u> Colorado State Fair sweep

Our Simmental breed dominated the 2019 Colorado State Fair, with a SimAngus female being named multi-breed Supreme Grand Champion Junior Heifer and a Simmental female being named multi-breed Supreme Reserve Grand Champion Junior Heifer. Congrats to new CJSA member Jacob Pfannebecker and to Cash Pratt, respectively.

On the hill, the facilities, arrival locations, stalling, etc. all remain as usual. However, a new hill <u>check-in</u> system is being implemented by ASA, which CSA will use in 2020. No cattle will come to our check-in crew, rather we will have back numbers and a computer ring-side at the bull pen show in the yards on Sunday afternoon, and hill exhibitors will just come check in.

We need help on each & every show day, plus volunteers to sell and calculate on People's Choice Power Simmental, and for the pre-sale BBQ and at *The One* sale.
