DENVER - Colorado Simmental Association announces a sale management change for the breed's 2023 sale at the National Western Stock Show.



In mid-April, ASA trustees met in Bozeman, Montana face to face for the first time in a year. What a refreshing feeling to see and interact with other trustees and ASA staff members. There is something to be said when a group can get together and work toward a common goal to improving the breed.

To touch on some high points, the Breed Improvement Committee put a resolution before the board to adopt a policy concerning gene editing. It basically gives the ASA broad guidelines to follow on a case-by-case basis, similar to cloning. I'm sure this will be a moving policy as we go further.

DNA pricing has changed slightly, and ASA tacked on the cost increase from Neogen. Tom Schulz from Neogen also addressed the board with an update regarding the long turnaround time, supply issues, and worker shortage. It's all related to Covid-19. He stated that no excuses were acceptable. Personally, I still feel that until our world gets back on track, we need to be somewhat understanding. Moral of this story is to submit your DNA <u>early</u>.

All of the Activity & Events Committee's resolutions presented to the board involved the approval of judges and judge lists for the following years. From the Growth & Development Committee's review, ASA will continue its relationship with the Grant Company, the firm Chip Kemp works with in promoting Simmental.

The Policy & Procedure Committee put forth a directive toward staff and legal counsel to produce an alcohol policy to be handed out at regional and national classics. There have been issues with some adults and we want to make sure that events are conducted in an appropriate manner. This directive is nothing more than using good judgment when an adult attends a junior activity.

The ASA is in a super place financially. We continue to make money, unlike many other Associations. I feel the leadership we have in place, along with the cattle, and a little luck are the reasons for our strong financial standing. The ASA is worth around \$21,000,000.
