The 2025 National Western Stock Show is just around the corner. Here are the updated highlights:

- Fri. 1/17 4 p.m. ASA annual meeting at the Embassy Suites Denver International Airport, 7001 Yampa Street, Denver. It will be followed at 6 p.m. with a Chairman's Reception & Foundation Auction.
- Sat. 1/18 10:30 a.m. (new start time) Bull pen show, with both the PTP pen show and the new P&G pen show; and People's Choice judging, all in the yards. The traditional PTP pen shows will be judged by Jay Hennessey of ND and associate Johnny Johnson of NE. Steve Eichacker of SD and associate Tim Curran of CA will judge the new P&G pen show.
- Sun. 1/19 9 a.m. Female pen show with People's Choice judging. It will be followed by a 1 p.m. sale preview and ASA Meet-n-Greet; and the 2 p.m. *The* One & Only sale with Power Simmental selection, all in the yards. Matt Macfarlane of M3 Marketing again is our sale manager.
- Mon 1/20 9 a.m. Junior shows on the hill with Justin Adcock and associate Bob Adcock both of IL officiating.
- Tues 1/21 9 a.m. Open class female and bull shows for a final year in the historic Stadium Arena. Chris Mullinix of KS and associate Daniel Dobbs of GA will officiate.

President Willie Altenburg of Fort Collins presented honors including naming Bridle Bit Simmentals as Breeder of the Year. The Erroll Cook family was praised for its exceptional, high-selling lots at its recent production sales, and its commitment to enhancing and promoting the breed, plus CSA lauded Chad Cook's service on the American Simmental Board of Trustees and the executive committee.
